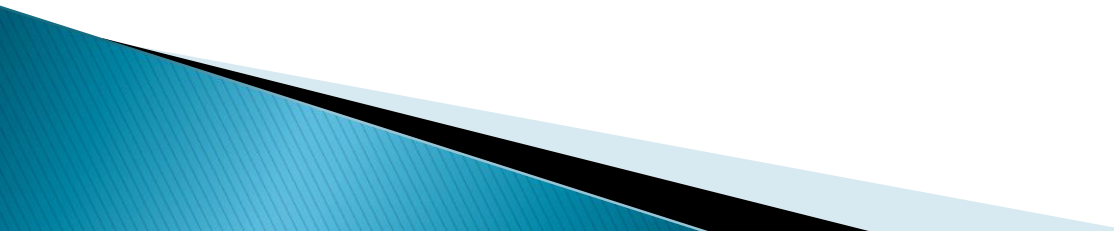

- ▶ Responses (January 8 – March 12, 2015)
 - Building Fires–12
 - Public Service– 4
 - Dispatched & cancelled enroute–18
 - Controlled burn–1
 - Brush Fires–4
 - Fire Alarm–1
 - Motor Vehicle Accident–4
 - Chimney Fire–1
 - Hazardous Chemical/Gas–1
 - **Total Calls–46**

Division of Emergency Communication (DEC)

- ▶ Weekly training/education continues
- ▶ Significant work during Valentine's Freeze 2015
 - 8 volunteers worked varying schedules during the week
 - Most were inside EOC
 - Main focus in EOC was relieving non-emergency dispatch responsibilities from E911 center
 - Serving as regional link between middle and east, using radio and internet
 - Some were in field: reporting on conditions, supporting shelters, assessing needs, etc
 - Assuring communications at Rescue Squad, shelters set up in churches
 - Some assisting with clients at shelter(s)
 - Reporting conditions in the field, especially when Cumberland County was totally without power and other communications

DEC, continued

- ▶ Total estimated hours worked: 254
- ▶ Value of work based on standard rates: \$6350
- ▶ Some details of work in support of E911 center
 - EOC job is to relieve 911 of need to handle non-emergency calls
 - We had read-only access to 911 CAD.
 - We transferred appropriate calls to our CAD for dispatch and all follow-up, allowing them to close the call on their CAD and concentrate on emergency calls
 - Volunteers and EOC staff used our CAD to dispatch appropriate service – e.g. fire, rescue, highway, EMS, etc for non-emergencies
 - VERY much appreciated by staff at E911 center

DEC, continued

- ▶ In 1st 24 hours of incident, we handled 2/3 of the calls coming in to 911
- ▶ Over the entire incident, we handled 44% of calls (non-emergency call % decreased as situations were handled) to 911
- ▶ Served as radio and internet link between Cumberland and some middle TN counties and weather service, utilities, etc.
- ▶ State Emergency Coordinator for ARES is asking for commendations for each operator from national level
- ▶ Ordering of equipment for back-up equipment portable box has begun
