- A Countywide Fire Department to be known as the Roane County Fire Department and the Powers and Duties set forth in Tennessee Code Annotated(TCA), Section 5-17-102
- A County Fire Tax Pursuant to TCA, Section 5-17-105
- Roane County Office of Emergency Services by Combining the Roane County Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security and the Roane County Fire Department


Resolution #06-08-08 (cont.)

- Roane County Office of Emergency Services is Responsible for the Direction and Control of all Aspects of Preparedness, Response, Mitigation, and Recovery to Natural and Man-made Emergencies and Disasters within the County
- Pursuant to the Provisions of TCA, Section 5-17-101(b) Delegates the Powers and Duties of the Roane County Fire Department to the Roane County Office of Emergency Services
- Pursuant to the Provisions of TCA, Section 5-17-105(a)(2) The Property Assessor was Directed to Notify all Property Owners within Affected Districts of the Fire Tax


Resolution #06-08-08 (cont.)

Fire Suppression Triangle




OES Organizational Chart












Hydrants per District
