- 3. **Justin Snow** of the Roane Alliance addressed the Commission to announce that the manufacturing company Malibu Boats is coming to Roane County, which is creating 770 new jobs with a \$75 million investment. Potential for a purchase of the Alba Health building in Rockwood was also announced, as a company has inquired about using the location. Mr. Snow also discussed upcoming and recurring events in Roane County and the efforts to foster growth and stability throughout.
- 4. **Nancy Hamilton** of the Roane County School Board, announced the recent successes of the Kingston High Golf Team at the state level. Those students who excelled, such as Brylee Crouse and Kailey Lane, earned top spots at the State Tournament held in Sevierville while representing the Kingston Yellow Jackets.

County Commission Meeting October 16, 2023 County Executive's Report

Wade Creswell, Roane County Executive, reported on the following at the Monday, October 16, 2023, County Commission meeting:

- Mr. Creswell reported that Jim Hart from CTAS has begun collecting data from Roane County jail to conduct a new jail study. This is important information to have before the county takes the next step of hiring a firm to develop a new master plan on the jail.
- Mr. Creswell gave an update on the continuing progress of the Roane County Health Department. The
 architect is near finalization of the design. The pre-bid meeting for the demolition of the interior of
 the building is this week.
- Mr. Creswell reported that the ambulance station on Gallaher Road is awaiting a certificate of
 occupancy. The county needs a permit from TDOT to be able to pour a driveway connecting to the
 highway, and the county is still awaiting the delivery of the garage.
- Mr. Creswell reported that the Opioid Council continues to do good work. The committee anticipates bringing a recommendation to the commission regarding settlement funds in January 2024.
- The Broadband Accelerate Team continues to work well past its assigned timeframe. The group saw
 the need to continue meeting and asked permission to do so. Their greatest challenge right now
 continues to be the accuracy of the coverage maps. One of their priorities is to officially challenge the
 maps so that members in the Roane County community aren't left out when funds are available to
 provide new service.
- Mr. Creswell presented a Proclamation to Barry Stephenson. Aid to Distressed Families of Appalachian Counties (ADFAC) will be honoring Mr. Stephenson at the 2023 11th annual Bill Wilcox Bow Tie Celebration & Fundraiser in November 2023 as someone whose actions have created positive local impact throughout the East Tennessee region, and County Executive Creswell is proclaiming November 4, 2023, as Barry Stephenson Day in Roane County, Tennessee.
- Mr. Creswell presented a Proclamation to Allen Lutz and proclaimed October 16, 2023, as a day of recognition and thanks for his years of dedication and passion for the students of Roane County and congratulated him on his upcoming retirement from The Roane Alliance.

WHEREAS, documented indigence will be required for the county to pay for an indigent burial/cremation; and

WHEREAS, the county will reimburse the funeral homes in these cases at their cost not to exceed \$1200; and

WHEREAS, each fiscal year a budget shall be established by the Roane County Commission for these reimbursements and once the fund is exhausted no more cremations will be reimbursed until the next budget cycle; and

WHEREAS, the county desires to update the written policy governing the handling of indigent cremations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Roane County Commission meeting in regular session on Monday, October 16, 2023 does hereby approve the attached updated Roane County Indigent Cremation Policy dated October 16, 2023.

Roane County Indigent Cremation Policy

In accordance with TCA§ 68-4-102, Roane County will provide for the cremation cost for residents of the county who are otherwise unable to pay for the cost of disposition of their remains. The County will provide a maximum of \$1200 paid directly to a funeral provider. Roane County's costs are limited to and will only authorize payment for cremation services.

Roane County will not reimburse for burial expenses already paid to the funeral home.

Roane County does not pay for out of state cremations. Roane County will not pay transportation costs for residents that die out of state to be transported back to Roane County.

Unclaimed Bodies

Pursuant to TCA §68-4-103, after notification of next kin, the body of the deceased shall be held for not less than ninety-six (96) hours. If at the end of that time, no provision has been made for the disposition of the remains, the chief medical examiner of the county shall be notified.

If the chief medical examiner, or the chief medical examiner's representative does not make demand for the body within seventy-two (72) hours, then the body shall be cremated in accordance with TCA §68-4-113.

Pursuant to TCA § 68-4-113, the coroner, medical investigator or county medical examiner may direct the cremation of an unclaimed dead body, provided that the proper notice is given and the body is held for the time period provided in TCA §68-4-103.

If the disposition of the remains of the decedent becomes the responsibility of the county, the public officer or employee responsible for arranging the final disposition of the decedent's remains shall have the right to control the location, manner and conditions of disposition per TCA §5-9-101(4).

For bodies received by funeral providers through the Office of the County Medical Examiner, an <u>Affidavit Requesting Payment for Cremation Services</u> (see attached) and an itemized invoice signed by the County Medical Examiner must be submitted.

A rotating list of funeral homes will be used to receive the unclaimed remains and perform the cremation services at the contractual price as agreed upon by both parties.

Pauper Burials

Pursuant to TCA §5-9-311, before the county can pay for a pauper's burial, an affidavit must be filed with the county showing the cost, and that the person was buried in the county, and that the claimant has no other means of obtaining payment. An <u>Affidavit Requesting Payment for Cremation Services</u> (attached) along with an itemized invoice must be submitted by the funeral provider to Roane County for payment. Also, the family must submit a <u>Uniform Civil Affidavit of Indigency</u> (attached) signed by a judge before payment will be approved.

Disposition of Remains

Remains will be retained for two (2) years and will then be disposed of in accordance with applicable state laws and regulations. The family may claim the remains by reimbursing the county for the cost of the cremation (\$1200) at any time up until two (2) years after the cremation. Remains will be stored at the funeral home which performed the cremation services in a manner of the funeral provider's choosing. The county makes no assurances of the handling of the remains and accepts no liability as to the handling of the remains.

August 2019

In August 2019, the Town of Oliver Springs, began planning improvements to be made at Arrowhead Park. This included a new concession stand with bathrooms, remodelling the baseball field facilities, LED lighting, WIFI access, addressing the drain issues around the track and softball fields, paving the track, and adding handicap accessibility to the track and softball fields. This work will be completed in four phases.

Completed Work

October 2020

In October 2020, Phase I was completed. Phase I included the construction of a new concession stand with mens and womens bathrooms, girls softball locker room, and roofing for the equipment storage building.

September 2022

In September 2022, Phase II work was completed on the O.S. High School Baseball Field Concession stand, bathrooms, pressbox, dugouts, and bleacher handrails.

Current and Future Work

September 2023

In July 2023, planning began on Phase III, which will include installing Qty. 4 - 6"x12' drain tiles under the track, paving (asphalt) 1,320 ft of the track, installing Qty. 2 - 12'x20' handicap acessibility entrances to the track and softball fields, and striping the parking lot appropriately. Phase III work is scheduled to begin in October 2023. Phase III cost estimates:

- 1. Drain Installation \$5,200
- 2. Track Paving \$22,000
- 3. Handicap Accesibility \$4,500
- 4. Parking Lot Marking/Striping \$3,600 Phase III Total Project Cost: \$35,300

October 2023

In October 2023, Phase IV project planning began on the replacement of high pressure sodium lighting with LED lighting and the installation of WIFI nodes onto the LED lights. This would provide free WIFI access to the users of Arrowhead Park and the residents of Oliver Springs.

Phase IV Cost Estimates:

- 1. LED Lighting \$12,000
- 2. WIFI Node Installtion \$9,600

Phase IV Project Cost: \$21,600

Estimated Phase III and Phase IV Project Cost \$56,900.


